16.2.3.8 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

A. Any applicant who has been subject to any action or proceeding comprehended by Subsection A of 16.2.3.8 NMAC (Part 3 of the Rules) may be subject to disciplinary action, including denial, suspension or revocation of licensure, pursuant to the provisions of NMSA 1978, Section 61-14A-17; and subject to the Uniform Licensing Act, NMSA 1978, Section 61-1-1, et seq., and subject to the Criminal Offender Employment Act, NMSA 1978, Section 28-2-1, et seq.

B. Any applicant who provides the board with false information or makes a false statement to the board may be subject to disciplinary action, including denial, suspension or revocation of licensure, pursuant to the provisions of Section 61-14A-17 NMSA 1978, and to the Uniform Licensing Act, NMSA 1978, Section 61-1-1, et seq.

16.2.3.9 EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS: Every applicant shall provide satisfactory proof that he completed a board approved educational program as defined in 61-14A-14 of the act and 16.2.7 NMAC. If the educational program is no longer in existence, or if the applicant's records are not available for good cause, the applicant shall submit an affidavit so stating and shall identify the educational program, and shall provide the address, dates of enrollment, and curriculum completed, along with such other information and documents as the board shall deem necessary. The board, in its sole and sound discretion, may accept or reject as adequate and sufficient such evidence presented in lieu of the records otherwise required.

16.2.3.10 ~~**[INITIAL LICENSURE APPLICATION:** Upon approval of an application for licensure that fulfills the requirements listed below, the board shall issue a license that will be valid until July 31 following the initial licensure, except that licenses initially issued after May 1 will not expire until July 31 of the next renewal period as defined in 16.2.8.9 NMAC; the application requirements for a license shall be receipt of the following by the board:]~~ **(CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS:)**

(A. Convictions for any of the following offenses, or their equivalents in any other jurisdiction, are disqualifying criminal convictions that may disqualify an applicant from receiving or retaining a license, including temporary licenses and auricular detoxification specialist certificates, issued by the board:

- (1) Assisting Suicide;
- (2) Obtaining fraudulently acquired transportation ticket at a discount;
- (3) Unauthorized transportation, transfer, sale or offer to sell seven or more unauthorized recordings embodying sound or seven or more audiovisual recordings
- (4) Advertising, offering for sale, selling, or possessing for these purposes any recording that the person knows does not contain the true name of the manufacturer in a prominent place on the cover, jacket or label of the recording
- (5) Bribery of participant in a contest
- (6) Willfully and knowingly violating the provisions of the Indian Arts and Crafts Sales Act
- (7) Third or subsequent convictions of theft of, or intentional damage of, communications or public utility equipment, whether customer- or utility-owned, which created a public safety hazard or causes a disruption of communications services or public utility services to ten or more households, customers or subscribers or caused monetary damage equal to or greater than one thousand dollars (\$1000) in value of equipment;
- (8) Knowingly authorizing or assisting in the publication, advertising, distribution or circulation of any false statement or representation concerning any subdivided land offered for sale or lease, or with knowledge that any written statement relating to the subdivided land is false or fraudulent, issuing, circulating, publishing or distributing it
- (9) Second or subsequent knowing, intentional or willful violation of the New Mexico Subdivision Act
- (10) Certain violations of the Mortgage Foreclosure Consultant Fraud Prevention Act
- (11) Any contractor who knowingly and intentionally signs an affidavit stating that all charges and costs arising from the furnishing of labor or materials for incorporation in the residential site have been paid when in fact all charges and costs have not been paid, or knowingly and intentionally fails to provide the names of persons who have presented invoices for costs and charges for labor or materials but who have not been paid for their labor or materials furnished
- (12) Any contractor or subcontractor justly indebted to a supplier of material or labor who accepts payment for construction and knowingly and intentionally applies the proceeds to a use other than paying those persons with whom he contracted
- (13) Knowingly and willfully obtain information on a consumer from a credit bureau under false pretenses; or knowingly and willfully provide information concerning a consumer from the credit bureau's files to a person or firm not authorized to receive that information
- (14) Certain violations of the Cigarette Enforcement Act
- (15) Certain acts related to the financing of automobile sales
- (16) Second and all subsequent violations of the Used Merchandise Act
- (17) Certain violations of the Antitrust Act
- (18) Knowingly shipping, driving, or receiving for shipment or driving livestock out of state without an inspection
- (19) Knowingly shipping sheep or goats outside the state without an inspection certificate
- (20) A person killing or causing to be killed any livestock for his own use or for the use of others or for the purpose in the whole or in part of sale or exchange is required to keep in his own possession, unchanged and unutilized and in condition to be easily inspected and examined, all hides or pelts and ears of cattle, sheep and goats, for the period of thirty days after the killing or until inspected by an inspector and shall at any time while the hides or pelts and ears remain in his possession permit them to be inspected and examined by a sheriff, deputy sheriff, inspector or other officer authorized by law to inspect any hides and pelts or livestock, whether dead or alive
- (21) Taking or killing a bighorn sheep, ibex, oryx, Barbary sheep, elk, deer or pronghorn antelope outside of the legal season or without a valid license, which taking or killing results in waste of the animal
- (22) Knowing violation of any provision of the Savings and Loan Act, with intent to defraud
- (23) Certain acts by credit union executive officer, director, committee member, employee or agent
- (24) Maliciously and knowingly spreading false reports or uttering false statements about the management of finances of any credit union
- (25) Making a false statement in writing for the purpose of obtaining credit union funds

- (26) The supervisor or any examiner, inspector, deputy, assistant or clerk appointed or acting under the provisions of the Savings and Loan act who fails to keep secret any facts or information regarding an association obtained in the course of an examination or by the reason of his official position, except when the public duty of the officer or employees requires him to report upon or take official action regarding the affairs of the association examined, or who willfully makes a false official report as to the condition of an association
- (27) Any person who knowingly makes, utters, circulates or transmits to another, or others any statement untrue in fact, derogatory to the financial condition of any association subject to the Savings and Loan Act or any federal association in this state with intent to injure the financial institution, or who counsels, aids, procures or induces another to originate, make, utter, transmit or circulate any such statement with like intent
- (28) Any officer, director, employee or agent of any association subject to the Savings and Loan Act who, for the purpose of concealing any fact or suppressing any evidence against himself or against any other person, abstracts, removes, mutilates, destroys or secretes any paper, book or record of any association or of the supervisor
- (29) Certain violations of the Mortgage Loan Company Act
- (30) Second or subsequent conviction for unlicensed activity contrary to the New Mexico Mortgage Loan Originator Licensing Act
- (31) Violation of the Endowed Care Cemetery Act
- (32) Manufacturing, selling, or distributing a device that is intended to be used to violate any provision of the Gaming Control Act
- (33) Marking, altering, or otherwise modifying any gaming device so as to affect the result of a wager by determining win or loss or altering the normal criteria of random selection that affects the operation of a game or that determines the outcome of a game
- (34) Certain violations of the Horse Racing Act
- (35) Having possession with the intent to sell or resell any alcoholic beverages which to that person's knowledge have been manufactured or transported into this state in violation of the laws of this state
- (36) Willfully violating, attempting to violate, or conspiring to violate a requirement of the Horse Racing Act or a prohibition specifically set forth in the Horse Racing Act
- (37) Influencing or attempting to influence the outcome of a horse race or entering into an agreement to predetermine the outcome of a horse race
- (38) Certain violations of the Gaming Control Act
- (39) Unlawful and intentional possession of an unlicensed or illegal gaming device
- (40) Manipulating, with the intent to cheat, any component of a gaming device in a manner contrary to the designed and normal operational purpose of the component, including varying the pull of the handle of a gaming machine with knowledge that the manipulation affects the outcome of the game or with knowledge of any event that affects the outcome of the game
- (41) Knowing possession of any gaming device that has been manufactured, sold or distributed in violation of the Gaming Control Act
- (42) Knowingly permitting an individual who the person knows is younger than twenty-one years of age to participate in gaming
- (43) Knowingly making a statement or entry that is false or misleading, or failing to maintain or make an entry the person knows is required to be maintained or made, in an application, book or record required to be maintained by the Gaming Control Act or by a regulation adopted under that act or in a report required to be submitted by that act or a regulation adopted under that act
- (44) Willful violation, attempt to violate or conspiracy to violate any of the provisions of the Gaming Control Act specifying prohibited acts, the classification of which is not specifically stated in that act
- (45) Knowingly cheating at any game subject to the Gaming Control Act
- (46) Forcibly or by bribe, threat or other corrupt practice obstructing, impeding or attempting to obstruct the administration of the provisions of the Liquor Control Act
- (47) Selling or attempting to sell alcoholic beverages at any place other than a licensed premises or as otherwise provided by the Liquor Control Act
- (48) Willfully attempting to evade or defeat any regulatory fee or supervisory fee or the payment thereof imposed pursuant to the Professional Athletic Competition Act
- (49) Use of pari-mutuel wagering, directly or indirectly, in a manner that is not authorized by state law
- (50) Lessee of mineral lands cannot conceal, or attempt to conceal any of such returns, or in any manner defraud, or attempt to defraud, the state out of any such royalty

(51) Procuring the escape of any convict, or conniving at, aiding or assisting in the escape of any convict from the penitentiary, whether such convict escape or not

(52) Willfully setting on fire or igniting or causing to be set on fire or ignited any building equipment or anything whatsoever at or within any mine when any person is present in such mine at the time

(53) Knowingly removing or attempting to remove any device or related equipment from a mine or mine site with the intent to permanently deprive the employer of the device or equipment or knowingly tampers with or attempts to tamper with the device or equipment, without the authorization of the employer or the state mine inspector

(54) Intent to defraud uses on a public security or instrument of payment

(55) Misuse of public funds

(56) Attempts to evade or defeat property tax

(57) Tax Fraud

(58) Officers and employees engaged in the administration of the property tax prohibited from buying property sold for delinquent property taxes; penalties for violation; sales of real property in violation declared void

(59) Attempts to evade or defeat any tax

(60) Willful failure to collect and pay over taxes

(61) Requesting money, thing of value or promise in exchange for performance of official act

(62) Failure to disclose 3rd party marketers

(63) Knowingly appropriating cultural property located on state land

(64) Unauthorized excavation, injury or destruction of cultural property; criminal damage to

property

(65) Excavation of unmarked burials w/o permit

(66) Mineral lessee concealing returns in attempt to defraud the state

(67) Wrongful wearing of military uniform or facsimile

(68) Failure to appear for active national guard or state defense force service

(69) Engaging in unlawful sales to PED, school districts and school personnel

(70) Prohibits state health institutions from exceeding appropriations

(71) Certain violations of the Water Quality Act

(72) Certain violations of the Recycling and Illegal Dumping Act

(73) Certain violations of the Air Quality Control Act

(74) Director or officer of irrigation district cannot be interested, directly or indirectly, in any contract awarded or to be awarded by the board, or in the profits to be derived therefrom; or receive any bonus, gratuity or bribe

(75) Director or officer of irrigation district cannot receive a bribe or gratuity

(76) Unlawful voting, failure to perform official duties, or fraudulent counting of ballots in conservancy district elections

(77) Interference with access to salt lakes and shores of salt lakes

(78) Certain violations of the Motor Carrier Act

(79) Unlawful interference with the flight of an aircraft

(80) Injuring or threatening to injure a customer's credit because the customer refuses to pay charges resulting from cramming or slamming (telecommunications services)

(81) Giving false testimony or information as to any matter material to an examination by the Superintendent of Insurance

(82) Willfully making a false or fraudulent statement in any verified report or declaration under oath in connection with fraternal benefit societies

(83) Certain violations of the Sale of Insurance Securities Law)

(B. The board shall not consider the fact of a criminal conviction as part of an application for licensure unless the conviction in question is one of the disqualifying criminal convictions listed in Subsection A of this rule)

(C. The board shall not deny, suspend or revoke a license on the sole basis of a criminal conviction unless the conviction in question is one of the disqualifying criminal convictions listed in Subsection A of this rule.)

(D. Nothing in this rule prevents the board from denying an application or disciplining a licensee on the basis of an individual's conduct to the extent that such conduct violated the Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine Practice Act, NMSA 1978, Section 61-14A-1, et seq., regardless of whether the individual was convicted of a crime for such conduct or whether the crime for which the individual was convicted is listed as one of the disqualifying criminal convictions listed in Subsection A of this rule.)

(E. In connection with an application for licensure, the board shall not use, distribute, disseminate, or admit into evidence at an adjudicatory proceeding criminal records of any of the following:

- (1) an arrest not followed by a valid conviction;
- (2) a conviction that has been sealed, dismissed, expunged or pardoned;
- (3) a juvenile adjudication; or
- (4) a conviction for any crime other than the disqualifying criminal convictions listed in

Subsection A of this rule.)

~~[16.2.3.10]~~ **(16.2.3.11) INITIAL LICENSURE APPLICATION:** Upon approval of an application for licensure that fulfills the requirements listed below, the board shall issue a license that will be valid until July 31 following the initial licensure, except that licenses initially issued after May 1 will not expire until July 31 of the next renewal period as defined in 16.2.8.9 NMAC; the application requirements for a license shall be receipt of the following by the board:

- A.** the fee for application for licensure specified in 16.2.10 NMAC;
- B.** an application for licensure that is complete and in English on a form provided by the board that shall include the applicant's name, address, date of birth and social security number, if available;
- C.** two (2) passport-type photographs of the applicant taken not more than six (6) months prior to the submission of the application;
- D.** an affidavit as provided on the "initial licensure application" as to whether the applicant:
 - (1)** has been subject to any disciplinary action in any jurisdiction related to the practice of acupuncture and oriental medicine, or related to any other profession including other health care professions for which the applicant is licensed, certified, registered or legally recognized to practice including resignation from practice, withdrawal or surrender of applicants license, certificate or registration during the pendency of disciplinary proceedings or investigation for potential disciplinary proceedings;
 - (2)** has been a party to litigation in any jurisdiction related to the applicants practice of acupuncture and oriental medicine, or related to any other profession including other health care professions for which the applicant is licensed, certified, registered or legally recognized to practice;
 - ~~**(3)** has been convicted of a felony in any jurisdiction, including any finding of guilt by a court or jury, or any plea of guilty, or any plea of nolo contendere or no contest, or plea or disposition of conditional discharge, and including any such proceeding in which a sentence was imposed, suspended or deferred;~~
 - ~~**(4)**~~**(3)** is in arrears on a court-ordered child support payment; or
 - ~~**(5)**~~**(4)** has violated any provision of the act or the rules;
- E.** an official license history, which is a certificate from each jurisdiction stating the disciplinary record of the applicant, from each jurisdiction where the applicant has been licensed, certified, registered or legally recognized to practice any profession, including health care professions, in any jurisdiction, pursuant to any authority other than the New Mexico Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine Practice Act;
- F.** an affidavit as provided on the "initial licensure application" stating that the applicant understands that:
 - (1)** an applicant who has been subject to any action or proceeding comprehended by Subsection D of 16.2.3.10 NMAC may be subject to disciplinary action at any time, including denial, suspension or revocation of licensure, pursuant to the provisions of the act, NMSA 1978, Section 61-14A-17; and subject to the Uniform Licensing Act, NMSA 1978, Section 61-1-1, et seq., and subject to the Criminal Offender Employment Act, NMSA 1978, Section 28-2-1, et seq.; and
 - (2)** an applicant who provides the board with false information or makes a false statement to the board may be subject to disciplinary action, including denial, suspension or revocation of licensure, pursuant to the provisions of the act, NMSA 1978, Section 61-14A-17, and the Uniform Licensing Act, NMSA 1978, Section 61-1-1, et seq.;
- G.** an affidavit as provided on the "initial licensure application" stating that the applicant understands that:
 - (1)** the applicant is responsible for reading, understanding and complying with the state of New Mexico laws and rules regarding this application as well as the practice of acupuncture and oriental medicine;
 - (2)** the license must be renewed annually by July 31; and
 - (3)** the applicant must notify the board within ten (10) days if the applicant's address changes;

H. a copy of the applicant's certificate or diploma from an educational program evidencing completion of the required program; this copy shall include on it an affidavit certifying that it is a true copy of the original;

I. an official copy of the applicant's transcript that shall be sent directly to the board in a sealed envelope by the educational program from which the applicant received the certificate or diploma, and that shall verify the applicant's satisfactory completion of the required academic and clinical education and that shall designate the completed subjects and the hours of study completed in each subject; or this copy of the transcript shall remain in the closed envelope secured with the official seal of the educational program and shall be sent by the applicant to the board along with the applicant's application for licensure; and

J. an accurate translation in English of all documents submitted in a foreign language; each translated document shall bear the affidavit of the translator certifying that he or she is competent in both the language of the document and the English language and that the translation is a true and faithful translation of the foreign language original; each translated document shall also bear the affidavit of the applicant certifying that the translation is a true and faithful translation of the original; each affidavit shall be signed before a notary public; the translation of any document relevant to an application shall be at the expense of the applicant.

Each translated document shall bear the affidavit of the translator certifying that he or she is competent in both the language of the document and the English language and that the translation is a true and faithful translation of the foreign language original. Each translated document shall also bear the affidavit of the applicant certifying that the translation is a true and faithful translation of the original. Each affidavit shall be signed before a notary public. The translation of any document relevant to an applicant's application shall be at the expense of the applicant.

The board may, at its discretion, request further proof of qualifications or require a personal interview with any applicant to establish his or her qualifications. If requested by the board, all further proof of qualifications shall be received at the board office at least forty five (45) days before the clinical skills examination date. Any required personal interview will be scheduled as determined by the board.

than twenty one (21) days from the board's receipt of all required documentation. The board shall issue a license to all applicants who have met the requirements of 16.2.3 NMAC and 16.2.4 NMAC.
