**INDUSTRY BULLETIN: 26-02**

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**Immediate Recall – GH LLC License Number VIC-2025-0030 Medical Cannabis Product “Kush Pops” (200 mg THC per package flavors - Watermelon, Grape, Raspberry, Blueberry, Strawberry)**

Dear Licensee,

The New Mexico Cannabis Control Division (“CCD”) is issuing this industry bulletin to notify all licensees of a mandatory recall involving a medical cannabis product manufactured by GH LLC. A list of locations and product IDs can be found [here](#).

The CCD has determined that the product marketed as “GH Kush Pops” contains 200 mg of total THC per package, consisting of two individual 100 mg lollipops. Pursuant to the Cannabis Regulation Act and CCD regulations, medical cannabis products may contain no more than 50 mg of THC per serving. This product exceeds the maximum allowable THC per serving and is therefore noncompliant.

**Required Actions for All Licensees**

All licensed retailers and other licensees in possession of this product must:

1. Immediately cease all sales and transfers of GH Kush Pops (200 mg THC package configuration).
2. Quarantine and segregate all affected inventory to prevent further distribution.
3. Ensure the product remains subject to movement restrictions pending further instruction from the CCD.
4. Coordinate with GH LLC and the CCD regarding return, destruction, or other disposition procedures consistent with CCD guidance.

Licensees must ensure all inventory tracking records in BioTrack accurately reflect the product's status.

### **Consumer Communications**

Medical cannabis products are reserved for qualified patients holding a valid medical cannabis identification card. Retailers should be prepared to:

- Inform patients who purchased this product of the recall;
- Provide return or disposal options consistent with CCD guidance; and
- Direct patients experiencing adverse effects to contact the New Mexico Poison and Drug Information Center at 1-800-222-1222 or their healthcare provider.

While no health-related complaints have been reported to the CCD at this time, consumption of higher-than-permitted THC levels may increase the risk of impairment, anxiety, dizziness, rapid heart rate, or other unintended effects.

### **Compliance**

Failure to comply with recall directives, including continued sale or transfer of affected product, may constitute a violation of the Cannabis Regulation Act and applicable rules and may subject the licensee to enforcement action.
