#### **Continued Use of BioTrack and Industry Survey**

Dear New Mexico Cannabis Licensees and Stakeholders,

The Cannabis Control Division (CCD) is currently developing a successor track-and-trace system to replace the existing track-and-trace system provided through BioTrack.

Until further notice, the current track-and-trace system (BioTrack) remains in effect, and all licensees are required to continue utilizing the existing system in accordance with applicable regulatory requirements.

The CCD appreciates the industry's interest in this project and will provide updates through official communications as appropriate. To ensure that information is communicated consistently to all licensees, the CCD is not currently responding to individual questions regarding the development, functionality, implementation, transition, or timing of the successor system.

provided may assist the CCD in evaluating operational needs and developing the successor system.
