This is a reminder to all Cannabis Control Division (CCD) licensees that 5 p.m. MDT today, Aug. 25, 2026, is the planned cutoff for the transition from the legacy track-and-trace system, BioTrack, to the successor system, New Mexico Seed-to-Sale (NMS2S).

BioTrack Cutoff and Outstanding Manifests

The data download and migration process will begin at 5 p.m. today. Licensees should make every effort to complete pending activity in BioTrack before that time.

Retailers will not be able to accept outstanding manifests after 5 p.m. Even if BioTrack's appearance remains live and operational after that time, the data download and migration process will have begun, any non-retail sales transactions

input into BioTrack after 5 p.m. today will NOT be reflected in your inventory after migration.

Accordingly, any manifest that has not been accepted in BioTrack by the 5 p.m. cutoff will not be included in the data migrated to NMS2S as a completed transfer.

Please make every effort to ensure that all outstanding manifests are accepted in BioTrack before 5 p.m. so that the associated inventory is appropriately captured as part of the migration.

BioTrack Activity After 5 p.m.

Beginning at 5 p.m. today, all transfers and other track-and-trace transactions must cease. The only transactions that may continue to be entered into BioTrack after the cutoff are retail sales.

Retail licensees may continue conducting and recording compliant retail sales in BioTrack during the applicable transition period. Retailers may not accept manifests or receive transferred inventory after 5 p.m.

Licensees should not enter any other transactions into BioTrack after the cutoff, even if the system remains accessible. Licensees should maintain appropriate records of activities occurring during the transition period so that required information can be entered or reconciled in NMS2S when functionality becomes available.

NMS2S Access for Retailers and Cannabis Couriers – August 26

Tomorrow, August 26, 2026, a welcome email will be sent to the email address on file with CCD for the primary controlling person for each licensed retailer and cannabis courier.

The welcome email will provide the information necessary to access NMS2S at nms2s.org. Upon signing in, users will be able to:

- Set up multi-factor authentication;
- Access their NMS2S account;
- Generate bearer tokens for integrations; and
- Revoke bearer tokens when necessary.

Instructions explaining how to obtain and manage a bearer token will also be provided. Licensees using a point-of-sale or other third-party integration should follow those instructions to generate the bearer token necessary to connect their integration to NMS2S.

Receipt of the welcome email and access to NMS2S does not change the transition timeline or authorize transfers or other activity before the CCD announces that the applicable functionality is available.

Optional Recordkeeping Templates During the Transition

To assist licensees with maintaining records during the transition period, we have developed optional recordkeeping templates for producers and manufacturers. These spreadsheets provide example of the types of information licensees should document while certain NMS2S functionality is being established.

Use of these templates is not required. Licensees may use the CCD-provided templates, maintain their own spreadsheets or records, or use another recordkeeping method that captures the information necessary to accurately enter or reconcile activity in NMS2S.
